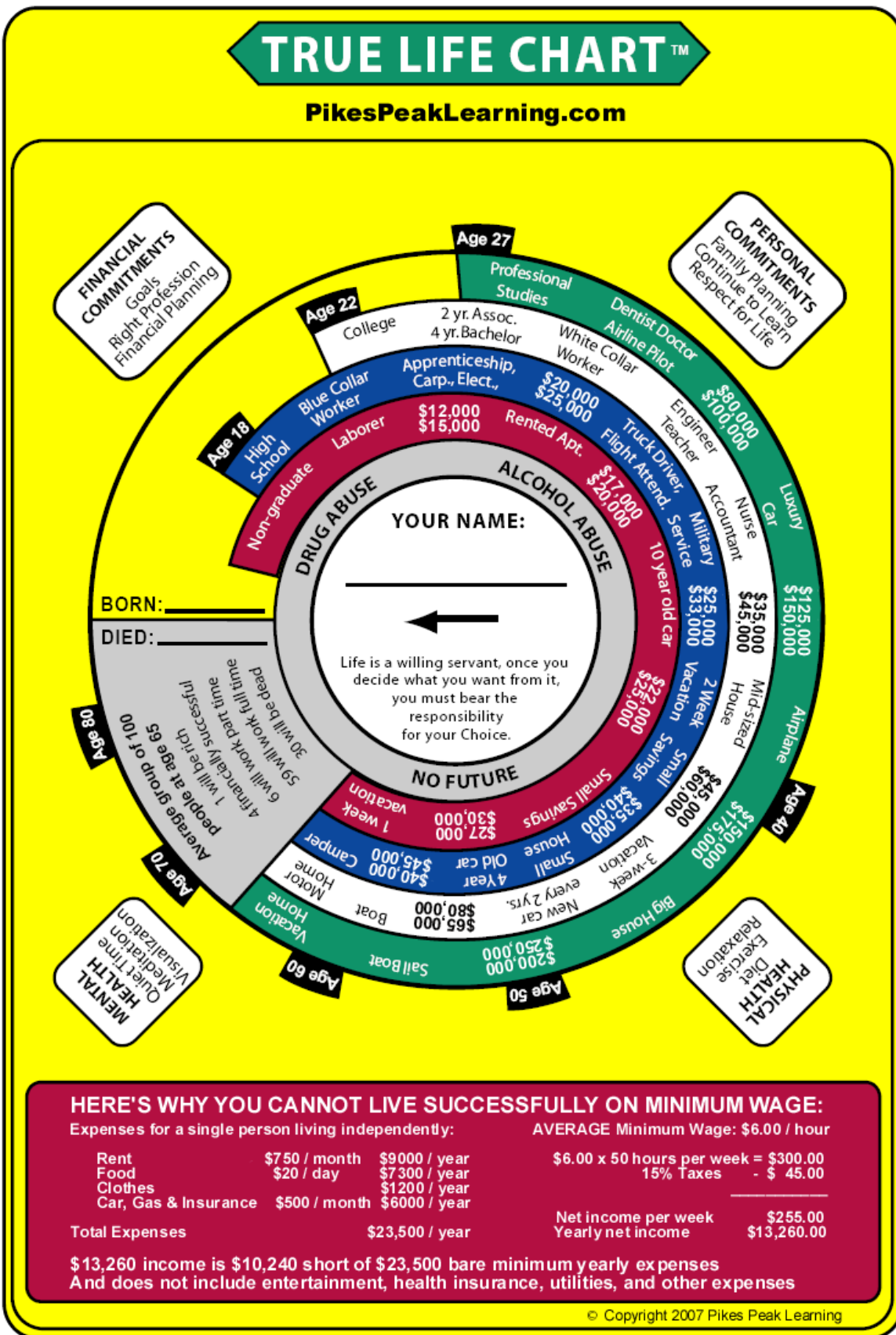


TRUE LIFE CHART™

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HERE'S WHY YOU CANNOT LIVE SUCCESSFULLY ON MINIMUM WAGE:

Expenses for a single person living independently:

AVERAGE Minimum Wage: \$6.00 / hour

| Rent | \$750 / month | \$9000 / year |
| Food | \$20 / day | \$7300 / year |
| Clothes | | \$1200 / year |
| Car, Gas & Insurance | \$500 / month | \$6000 / year |

\$6.00 x 50 hours per week = \$300.00
15% Taxes - \$ 45.00

Total Expenses \$23,500 / year

Net income per week \$255.00
Yearly net income \$13,260.00

\$13,260 income is \$10,240 short of \$23,500 bare minimum yearly expenses

And does not include entertainment, health insurance, utilities, and other expenses

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The True Life Chart is a color-coded guide that illustrates the typical relationships between education, careers, money, and lifestyles. **Red** shows the income and lifestyle of a typical high school dropout, **blue** shows typical blue collar workers, **white** shows typical white collar workers, and **green** shows higher paying professional careers. It offers a visual picture, similar to a road map, of how the real world works. It provides tools to explore education, career, money, and lifestyle as they relate to you and your life.
